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





- (b) The first edition has a at the beginning, meaning con pedale. The pedal indications in light print are by the editor. The Clara Schumann edition has a pedal indication only on the first count of measures 1, 3, 5, 7, 13 & 15, and a pedal indication from the last half of measure 16 to the end of the piece.
- (c) The una corda and tre corda indications are from the Clara Schumann edition.
