
Reading Chord Boxes

A chord box is basically a diagram of how a chord is played on the neck of the Ukulele. It shows you which string to play, where to put your fingers and whereabouts on the neck the chord is played. G Dm This tells you not to play the string at all This tells you to play the string "open" (not fretted at all) The thick black line indicates the "nut" at the top of the Ukulele. Dots show where your fingers go Vertical lines indicates strinas G-C-E-A from left to right Horizontal lines indicate frets The chord name Emaj⁷ Cm⁷ is shown above the chord box This indicates a "barre" – lie your first finger across these notes to play this chord. 3fr 4fr This shows you which fret the chord starts on (if played further up the neck from the nut)
